### Upcoming Grade 4 Health Unit

Part of the Grade 4 curriculum deals with puberty and the changes in the body related to it. We will be following a unit plan with lessons provided by Alberta Health Services.

Topics covered will include the physical changes in both boys and girls as they get older, emotional changes and social changes. Handouts will be sent home after each lesson. Ground rules will be established regarding respectful discussion. Please be aware that you may choose to have your child excused from these lessons if you so wish. The exemption must be completed in a written format and sent to me at the school.

Lesson 1—helps to establish a comfort level and begins to examine puberty changes

Lesson 2—helps students examine puberty changes and discover those unique to one gender vs. both

Lesson 3—encourages students to review puberty changes and identify support people to assist them in changes


Lesson 4—examines puberty and personal hygiene focuses on ways to address physical changes

Lesson 5—encourages students to answer some difficult questions about dealing with puberty and begin to create a positive self-image for the future

Lesson 6—ensures students are comfortable with puberty changes and celebrates each student
