You can add ed, er, or ing to some words without changing the spelling of the base word. Study these examples:

clean + ed = cleaned

wish + ing = wishing

learn + er = learner

sing + er = singer

## **TIP**

When a word ends in silent e, the e is usually dropped before adding an ending or suffix that begins with a vowel.

trade + ed = traded

move + er = mover

surprise + ing = surprising

## TIP

When a short-vowel word ends in a single consonant, the consonant is usually doubled before adding an ending that begins with a vowel:

hum + ing = humming

In words with two or more syllables, the final consonant is usually doubled if the last syllable has a short vowel followed by a single consonant:

outfit + ed = outfitted


When a word ends in y preceded by a consonant, change the y to i before adding an ending, unless adding the ending ing.

worry + es = worries  
dry + ing = drying  
copy + ed = copied  
fry + ing = frying


## TIPS

Adjectives ending in er compare two things. Adjectives ending in est compare three or more things. To add er or est to an adjective that ends in y, change the y to i first.  
happy + er = happier  
happy + est = happiest
